

Jaquith Public Library Receives IMLS Grant for Marshfield Story Project

Jaquith Public Library is pleased to announce that we are recipients of a 2019 Accelerating Promising Practices for Small Libraries Program Grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services. The award will provide funding of \$42,967, over the course of 2 years, for development of ***Marshfield Story Project - Sharing Memories Across Generations***.

Our proposal was one of 30 selected by the IMLS out of 114 submissions from rural libraries nationwide. ***Marshfield Story Project*** will bring together our community – young, older and in between – to preserve Marshfield's community memory through intergenerational dialog, oral history and creating a digital archive.

We are excited and honored to begin Marshfield Story Project in September. In the coming weeks we will share information about how you can participate!
